

**SPECIFIC PROVISIONS FOR CONDUCTING
“MGIMO INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL OLYMPIAD” COMPETITION
IN THE PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

1. General Provisions

1.1. This Appendix has been developed in accordance with the Regulations of the “MGIMO International School Olympiad” Competition (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”) and establishes the specific arrangements for organizing and conducting the Competition (hereinafter referred to as the “Competition”) for participants from the People’s Republic of China (PRC).

1.2. The legal framework for conducting the Competition in the territory of the PRC comprises this Appendix, as well as the Regulations and the Rules and Procedures for Conducting the Competition, to the extent that they do not conflict with this Appendix.

2. Organization and Conduct of the Competition

2.1. The Competition in the territory of the PRC is conducted in a single stage and in person.

2.2. The Competition Organizing Committee is responsible for conducting the Competition in the territory of the PRC. The venue, date, and time of the Competition are determined by the Competition Organizing Committee and published on the official Competition website no later than 30 (thirty) calendar days prior to the date of the Competition.

3. Participant Registration

3.1. To participate in the Competition, a candidate must complete the registration procedure on the official Competition website <http://int-olymp-mgimo.com> within the timeframe established by the Competition Organizing Committee.

3.2. Registration is carried out in accordance with the procedure set forth in Section 2 of the Rules and Procedures for Conducting the Competition.

4. Procedure for Conducting the Competition Stage

4.1. The Competition Stage for participants from the PRC is conducted in person and consists of a single written competition assignment.

4.2. Before beginning the competition assignment, a participant must provide a representative of the Organizing Committee with an identity document and a certificate (or a copy thereof) issued by the participant's educational institution confirming the participant's status as a student (school student).

4.3. The competition assignment consists of two parts (sections):

- an **English language test**;
- an **interdisciplinary section in Chinese**, covering the fundamentals of geography, world history, and international relations.

4.4. During the competition assignment, participants are prohibited from using reference materials, means of communication, electronic computing devices, or exchanging information with other participants. Violation of this rule constitutes grounds for removing the participant from the venue and invalidating their results.

4.5. Retaking the competition assignment is not permitted.

5. Assessment of Competition Assignments and Determination of Results

5.1. The competition assignments submitted by participants from the PRC are assessed by the Competition Jury in accordance with the criteria approved by the Methodological Commission.

5.2. Competition results for all participants from the PRC are determined as a single ranking, without division into language groups.

5.3. Winners of the Competition are participants who, based on the results of the Competition, are awarded First-Degree Diplomas. No more than five participants from the PRC who obtain the highest scores in the Competition Stage shall be designated as winners. In the event that several participants receive the same number of points, the winner is determined by the Competition Organizing Committee upon the recommendation of the Jury.

5.4. Prize-winners of the Competition are participants who, based on the results of the Competition, are awarded Second-Degree Diplomas. No more

than three participants from the PRC ranked from sixth to eighth place based on the scores obtained in the Competition Stage shall be designated as prize-winners. In the event that several participants receive the same number of points, the prize-winners are determined by the Competition Organizing Committee upon the recommendation of the Jury.

5.5. The lists of winners and prize-winners are approved by the Competition Organizing Committee and published on the official Competition website: <http://int-olymp-mgimo.com>.

6. Final Provisions

6.1. In all matters not regulated by this Appendix, the parties shall be guided by the Regulations and the Rules and Procedures for Conducting the “MGIMO International School Olympiad” Competition.
